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Introduction

The week's most popular songs ranked by sales data, as compiled by Luminate.





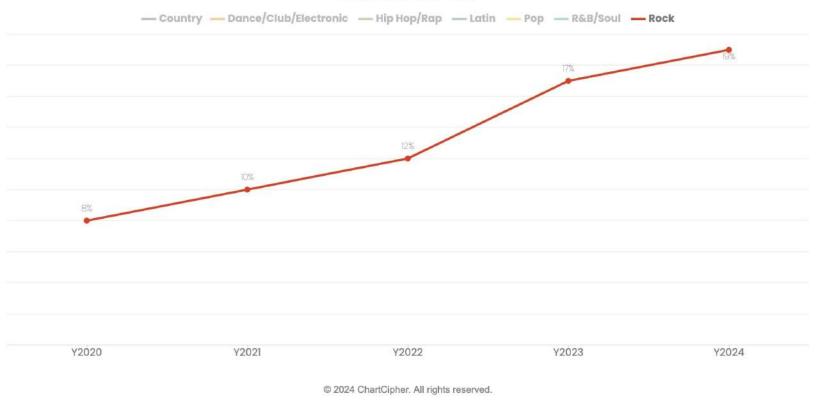
Billboard Hot 100 Rock: Primary Genre

The presence of rock as a primary genre in the Billboard Hot 100 has seen a consistent and notable **increase from 8% in 2020 to 19% in 2024**, more than doubling its representation over five years.

Genres: 2020 to 2024



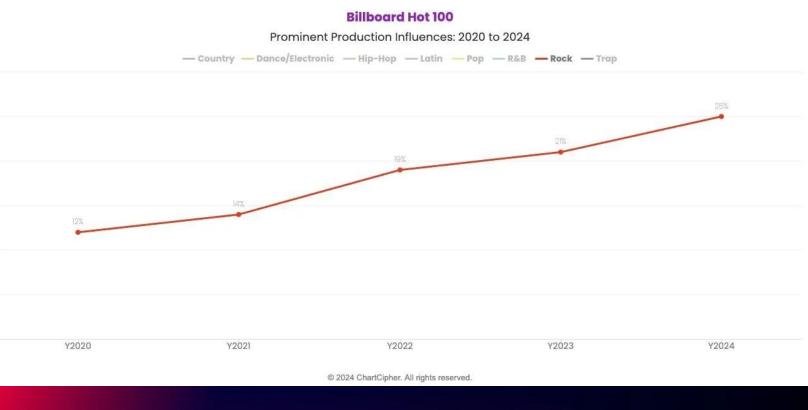

Moreover, the incorporation of rock elements in production has surged from **12% in 2020 to 25% in 2024**.

The simultaneous rise in rock production influences suggests that even songs that aren't exclusively classified within the rock genre are increasingly integrating rock-inspired sounds and techniques.

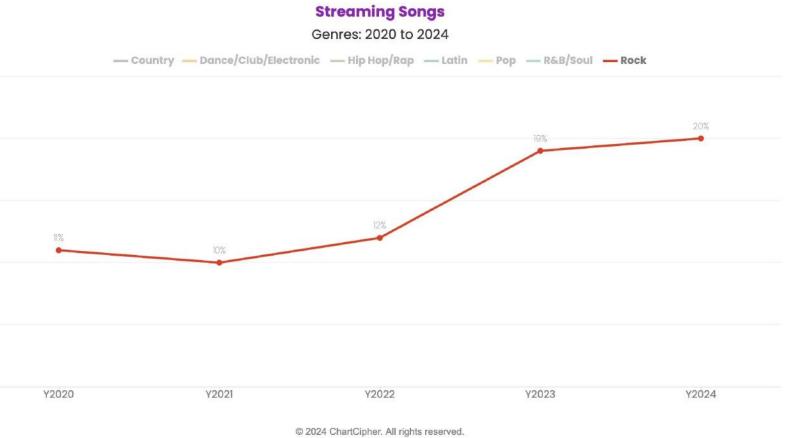




Streaming Songs Rock: Primary Genre

On streaming platforms, rock as a primary genre has increased from **11% in 2020 to 20% in 2024**, reflecting a robust revival among listeners.

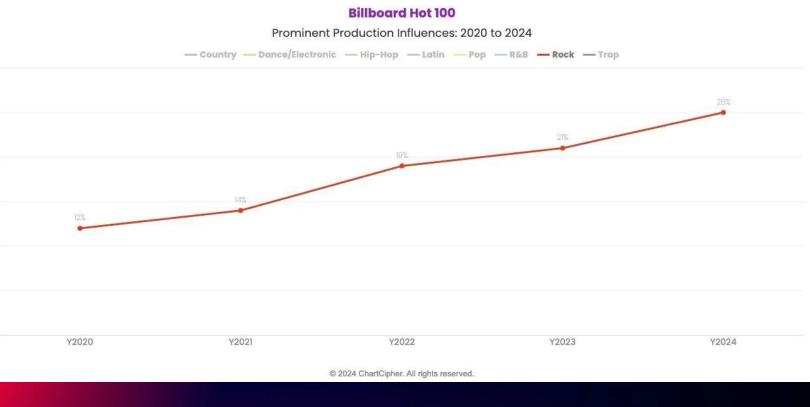




Streaming Songs Rock: Prominent Production Influence

As with the Hot 100, there was a simultaneous rise in rock as a prominent production influence among streaming songs, increasing from **14% to 26%,** further underscoring this trend and indicating that songs not strictly classified under the rock genre are incorporating rock elements into their production.

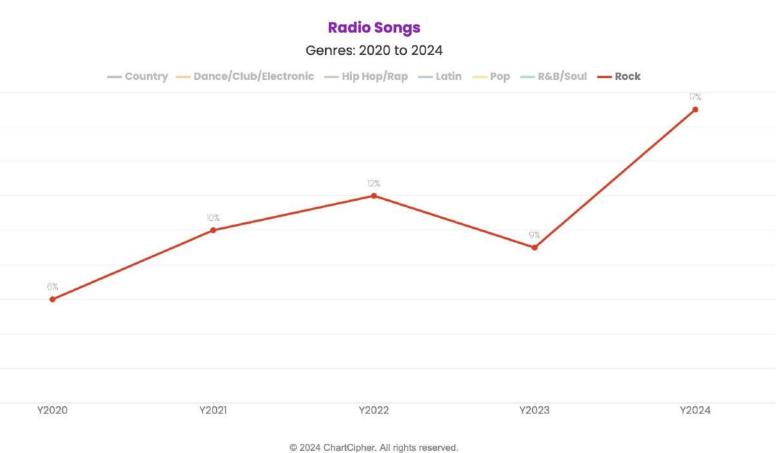




Radio Songs Rock: Primary Genre

Rock as a primary genre among radio songs also increased. Over a five-year period, rock nearly tripled, increasing from **6% in 2020 to 17% in 2024.**



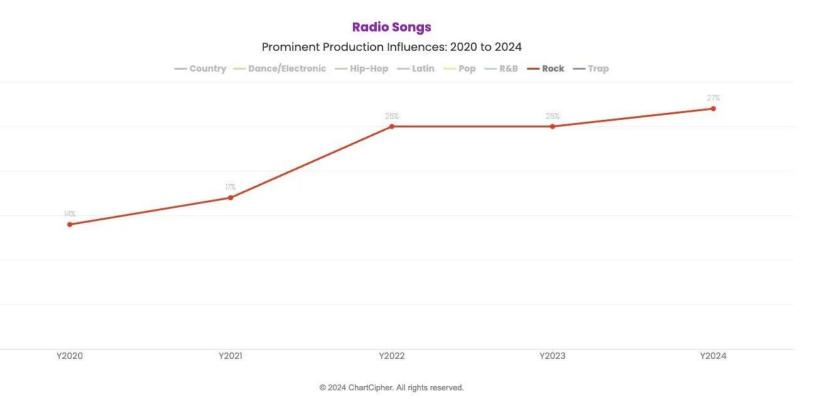

Rock: Prominent Production Influence

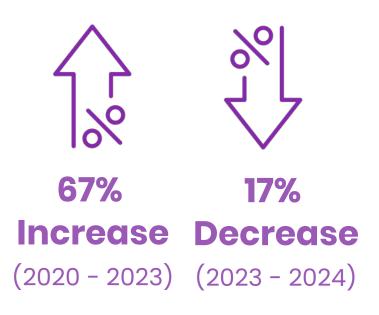
Rock production influences also increased among radio songs. Songs with a prominent rock production influence nearly doubled, rising from **14% in 2020 to 27% in 2024**. As with streaming and radio songs, this increase indicates the growing adoption of rock elements into the production of songs outside the rock genre.

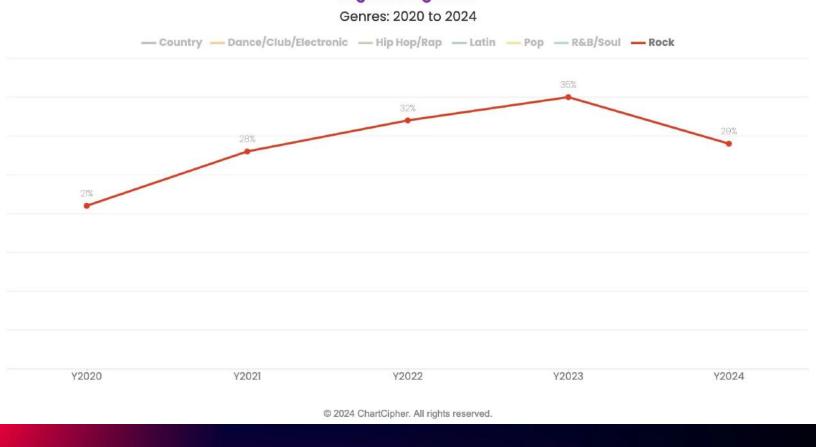




Digital Songs Sales Rock Primary Genre

Rock as a primary genre in digital song sales grew significantly from **21% in 2020 to a peak of 35% in 2023**. However, the trend reversed in **2024, declining to 29%.**



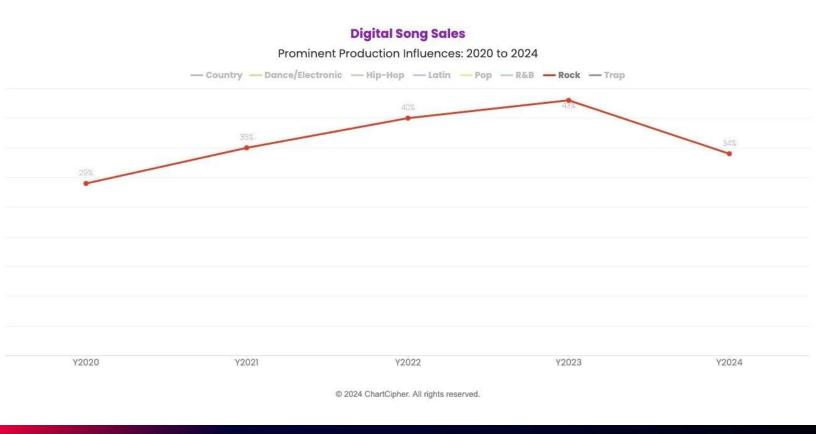


Digital Song Sales

Digital Songs Sales Rock Prominent Production Influence

Songs with rock production influences also rose among digital song sales, increasing from **29% to 42% between 2020 and 2023**. In 2024, however, the percentage **dropped to 34%**.





Conclusion

The resurgence of rock music in recent years marks a notable trend shift and illustrates a growing appetite for its distinctive sound and production qualities.

Among the songs charting on the Billboard Hot 100 and Streaming Songs charts, rock songs nearly doubled since 2020. Among radio songs, they nearly tripled.

Digital song sales, which experienced a strong increase in rock songs between 2020 and 2023, saw a decline between 2023 and 2024. However, rock still accounts for a substantial portion of digital song sales at 29%.
